

Earthen architecture around the world

The International Centre for Earth Construction *CRAterre*, created in 1979, is linked to the National Superior Architecture School of Grenoble (France). The Center has the recognition of UNESCO Chair and is a world reference in the field of earthen architecture. *CRAterre* works towards the recognition of earth materials and other local resources as a valid response to the challenges of protecting the environment, valorising and promoting cultural diversity, optimizing the use of local human and natural resources and improving housing and living conditions. Their projects facilitate the active participation of all the stakeholders involved: institutional representatives, professionals and local community members.

CRAterre improves and disseminates knowledge and good practices at the international level. The Centre assembled a multidisciplinary and international team of researchers, professionals, lecturers and trainers, working in collaboration with many partners, as a means to establish creative links between research, on-the-field activities as well as training, knowledge dissemination and sensitization activities. The CRAterre's capacities for innovation and multidisciplinary integration are widely recognized and inspire many institutions around the world and it is open to establish new collaborations with institutions, universities and social actors of interested countries.
