GLOBAL FOREST RESOURCES ASSESSMENT 2015 PUBLISHED BY FAO

In September 2015, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations FAO presented in the <u>World Forestry Congress</u>, co-organized by FAO and the Government of South Africa, the Global Forest Resources Assessment 2015: *How are the world's forest changing?*

The Global Forest Resources Assessment is conducted every five years and summarizes findings and data sources and links to more detailed publications and online resources.

The FAO General Director underlines that the contributions of forests to the well-being of humankind are extraordinarily vast and far-reaching. Forests play a fundamental role in combating rural poverty, ensuring food security and providing decent livelihoods; they offer promising mid-term green growth opportunities; and they deliver vital long-term

environmental services, such as clean air and water, conservation of biodiversity and mitigation of climate change.

Sustainably managed forests provide essential goods and services and thus play a vital part in sustainable development. Reliable and up-todate information on the state of forest resources is crucial to support decision-making for investment and policymaking in forestry and sustainable development.
