



The Historian Office of Havana presents his experience in Guatemala and El Salvador

The experience of the Historian Office of Havana (OHCH) in the integrated management of heritage was submitted by Cuba in the [Central American Seminar](#) on the Conservation and Valorization of Cultural Heritage, held in Guatemala and El Salvador.

The Historian Office of Havana City manages since 1994 a Master Plan for Integrated Revitalization, which is the tool to set in order strategies and actions for the recovery of The Old Havana, declared a national monument by the Cuban State and part of the UNESCO World Heritage. The Office has developed and implemented highly innovative approaches and methods of management, recognizing the strategic importance to economic and social regeneration, closely linked to the heritage rescue. Understood the three dimensions with an inclusive approach, the involvement of citizens in the process is ensured.

Currently the Old Havana is a laboratory for testing a new vision of ancient area management and the experience of the Historian Office of Havana has won numerous awards and recognitions from prestigious institutions.
