

DUBAI INTERNATIONAL PRIZE 2014

The Dubai Municipality announced the 2014 [Dubai International Award for Best Practices \(DIABP\)](#) and invited private and public institutions, NGOs, universities and research centers around the world to submit their nominations. The DIABP award was established in 1995 during the UN International Conference, in order to valorize best practices improving the living environment. Best practices are defined by the United Nations and the international community at large as successful initiatives which:

- Have a demonstrable and tangible impact on improving people's quality of life;
- Are the result of effective partnerships between the public, private and civic sectors of society;
- Are socially, culturally, economically and environmentally sustainable.

The Award reflects the policy and commitment of Dubai Government and the United Arab Emirates towards sustainable development of human settlements and protection of the environment on the basis of mutual international cooperation. Twelve prizes are offered each cycle for six categories of winners:

- Best Practices Award: 6 Winners
- Best Practices Transfer Award: 2 Winners
- University Research Award: 2 Winners
- The last two (Private Sector Award and Personal Award) consist in a Trophy and a Commemorative Certificate especially designed for the award.

The selection of winners is undertaken by an independent technical and advisory Committee. This Committee identifies the best practices and prepares a shortlist to be presented to an International Jury for selection of the award winners. All the best practices are collected in a database published in the DIABP's website.

The deadline for receiving nominations is June 1, 2014.
