

AGFUND INTERNATIONAL PRIZE 2020 FOR THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOAL *ZERO HUNGER*

The Arab Gulf Programme for Development AGFUND announces the 2020 Prince Talal International Prize for Human Development for innovative projects that best contribute to achieving the second Sustainable Development Goal 2030: *Eliminating hunger, providing food security and improved nutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture.*

The Prize Committee invites research centers, universities, organizations, associations and Foundations to submit nominations. The projects that best contribute to achieving the targets of the second Sustainable Development Goal 2030 *Zero Hunger*, shall be eligible to compete for AGFUND Prize 2020 that amounts to US\$1,000,000. Selecting this subject, the AGFUND Prize intends to contribute to the efforts that aim to reduce the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Prize covers the four categories as follows:

- First category prize (US\$400,000), for projects nominated by UN Agencies or international and regional organizations;
- Second category prize (US\$ 300,000), for projects nominated by national NGOs;
- Third category prize (US\$ 200,000), for projects nominated by governmental bodies, public institutions, social business enterprises, Foundations;
- Fourth category prize (US\$ 100,000), for projects initiated or led by individuals.

AGFUND International Prize for Pioneering Human Development Projects was established in 1999 by the Arab Gulf Programme for Development (AGFUND) with the aim of inciting and encouraging innovation and creativity in the areas of human development. The Prize is supervised by an international committee of renowned development leaders, who are selected based on their efforts and contributions to human development.

In April 2020, AGFUND has announced the winners of International Prize for Human Development 2019 for the Sixth Sustainable Development Goal of the 2030 Agenda: *Water and Sanitation*. The Committee of the AGFUND Prize has approved four projects carried out in Bangladesh, Yemen, Malawi and Ghana.

The deadline for receiving nominations for the 2020 International Prize is 15 December 2020.
