WINNERS OF THE 2019 EDITION ENERGY GLOBE WORLD AWARD

In November 2019 the Energy Globe Award announced the winners of the 2019 edition and their best solutions in combating climate change. The seven winners received a prize for their work at the Award Ceremony that took place in Espoo, Finland.

The aim of the Energy Globe

Award, <u>founded in 1999 in Austria</u>, is to raise global attention and to motivate people to become active on sustainable, globally appropriate environmental solutions, ranging from high-tech to simple but highly efficient ones. Eligible for participation are projects with a focus on saving resources, improving air, soil, or water quality, increasing energy efficiency, using renewable resources, as well as all those giving a contribution towards the fight against climate change. An important international declaration on the *Circular Economy* was also signed at the 2019 International Awards Ceremony in Finland.

With more than 187 participating countries and over 2.000 project submissions annually, the Energy Globe Award is a prestigious environmental prize worldwide. Projects can be entered by individuals as well as companies, organizations, and public authorities. Several projects may be entered by a single competitor and participation is free of charge.

In addition to the seven <u>winning projects of the 2019 edition</u>, the Energy Globe Award also recognized the important innovative contribution of other eleven projects declared as finalists and presented on the official Energy Globe website:

- Category Youth: <u>MEGA Game: Connecting People for a</u> <u>Sustainable Future. Moldovan Environmental Governance</u> <u>Academy (MEGA)</u> from Republic of Moldova.
- Special Category Energy for All: <u>Solar Power Solution for</u> <u>Indonesia's Poorest. PT Selaras Daya Utama</u> from Indonesia.
