- The SEED Low Carbon Awards 2019 in Ghana, India, Indonesia, South Africa, Thailand and Uganda, sponsored by the International Climate Initiative of the German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety.
- The SEED Africa Awards 2019 in Malawi, Zambia, Zimbabwe, sponsored by the Government of Flanders.
- The SEED South Africa Awards 2019 in South Africa, sponsored by the Government of Flanders.

The SEED Award winners will receive free access to supporting institutions and tailored one-on-one advisory services, as well as additional marketing and promotional activities by SEED. The winners will also join the network of the enterprises in Africa, Asia and Latin America, laureates of the SEED Awards.

The SEED website presents the <u>innovative enterprises</u> <u>winners of the 2018 Low Carbon Awards</u>. The five exemplary eco-inclusive enterprises that contribute to climate change adaptation and/or mitigation have been selected by the SEED International Jury from more than 250 applications coming from Colombia, India, Tanzania, Thailand, and Uganda.

- <u>Amazóniko, Bogota, Colombia</u>. Uses WebApp to incentivize collaborative recycling & green consumption.
- <u>Corporación Acción Semilla, Marinilla, Colombia</u>. Collecting and transforming organic waste into fertilizer.
- <u>Daily Dump, Bengaluru, India</u>. Providing waste management products and services for green living.
- <u>EcoAct, Daar es Salaam, United Republic of Tanzania</u>. Upcycles plastic waste into durable, affordable plastic timber for construction.











• <u>Khainza Energy Limited, Campala, Uganda</u>. Produces high-quality methane for cooking fuel from organic waste.

The SEED website also presents all the eco-inclusive enterprises winning the different editions of the Awards and supported by the initiative. These enterprises are managing innovative technologies that could be of interest for other territories and local development actors.
